### Measure for students working on the Robin Pathway:

Our Robin pathway forms the first of one of three pathways. It has been designed for students that are working at the pre key stage stands. Drawing from the EYFS areas for development and play, students benefit from designed units of work that focus on attention, building awareness of learning without the need to access subject specific content.

The awareness that grown from the EYFS areas for development, focuses on the five areas for progression as detailed in the Engagement Model; persistence, realisation, exploration, anticipation and initiation. These skills help to support understanding, learning and building a whole child. Supported with our enrichment program and outdoor learning the students will experience a curriculum that is all encompassing and fosters engagement.

Tracking therefore is recorded against two different elements, which are My communication and My Sensory Play, below is the following data:

The other two pathways that we have are Kestrel and Eagle, which are semi-formal and formal respectively.

Kestrel Our Kestrel pathway forms is the second pathway, which is a semi-formal way of learning, curriculum links and subjects are explored through adapted National Curriculum. However, despite the more formal learning, lessons reflect sensory roots, and explorations with play and sensory profiling forming many of the targets for progress. Education, Health and Care targets still considered for individualised learning.

In addition to the curriculum offer, a full clinical team is based on the site five-days-a-week therefore, following the pyramid review of the requirements of the EHCP plan, provisions to meet occupation therapy, speech and language, and child psychology, will be met. Bestwood Village school offers a fully functioning therapy room (SI), in addition to an immersion room which is used to support with tension reduction.



Our Eagle pathway is the third and final pathway is the formal pathway, that used the National curriculum, however, in an adapted way that allows out students to access all aspects of learning.

Literature rich curriculum draws from the rich history of fiction and non-fiction books, both contemporary and classical including poetry and prose. Mathematics will explore the 3 areas, number, shape and applications. With basics sciences, Humanities covered in About the World. Target led through ECH plans and sensory profiles offering a unique and inclusive holistic, child centred approach.
